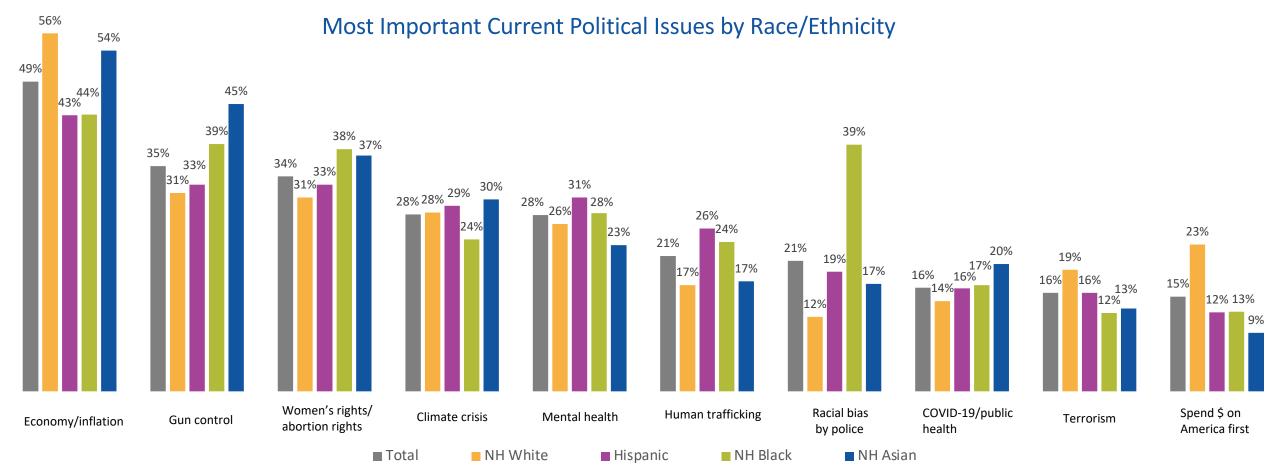

## **Most Important Political Issues by Race/Ethnicity**



For all race/ethnicities, economy/inflation is of the utmost concern. NH Blacks find racial bias by police to be a much more important political issue than other race/ethnicities.

After the economy, the most important issues to Hispanics are women's rights, gun control, mental health, and the climate crisis. Compared to other race/ethnicities, NH Whites want to see money being spent on America first before anything else. Hispanics find mental health and human trafficking more important than any other groups.



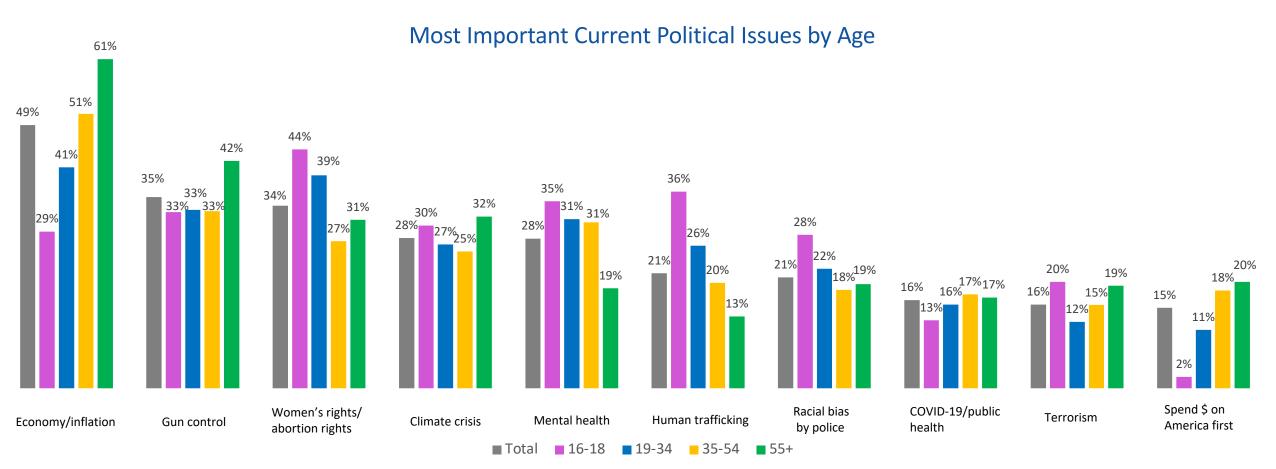

#### **Most Important Political Issues by Age**



The overall most important political issue is economy/inflation. For those 19+, this tops all other issues. Those 16-18 care most about women's rights/abortion rights, followed by human trafficking and mental health.

Those 55+ are also concerned with gun control and mental health, as are 35-54-year-olds. Women's rights and mental health are next on the priority list for those 19-34.

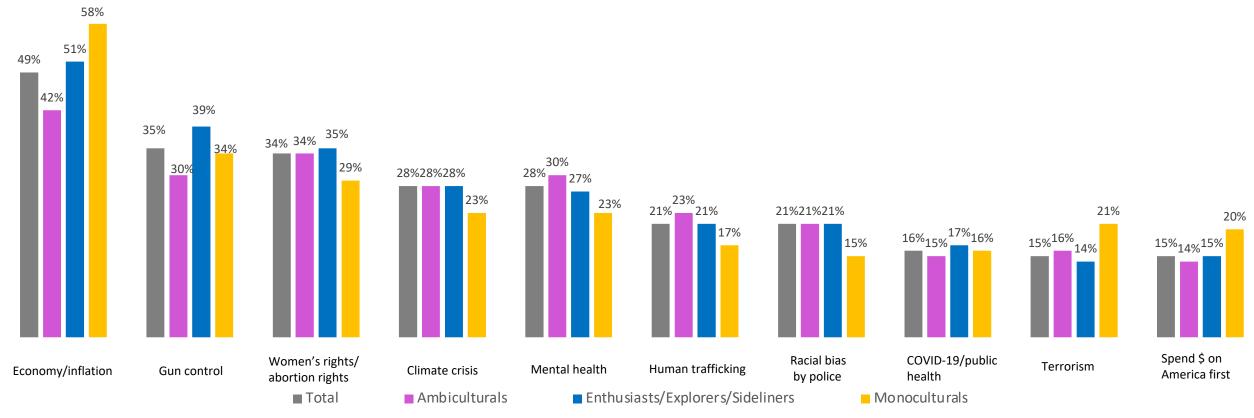
#### **Most Important Political Issues by ICA**



The economy/inflation is more important to Monoculturals (58%) than to other ICA groups. Issues such as terrorism and spending on America first are also important to this group.

Enthusiasts/Explorers/Sideliners care more about issues such as gun control (39%) and women's rights (25%) than other groups. Ambiculturals are the most concerned with mental health (30%) and human trafficking (23%) when compared to other groups.

#### **Most Important Political Issues by ICA - Indices**



In comparison to the total population, Ambiculturals find the opioid epidemic to be more important, with an index of 121; they also care a lot about LGBTQIA+ rights at an index of 119 when compared to the total pop.

Monoculturals feel strongly about supporting law enforcement (index, 140), terrorism (index, 137), and spending on America first (index, 135) when compared to the total population. However, they feel less strongly on issues such as eliminating racial bias by the police with an index of 75.

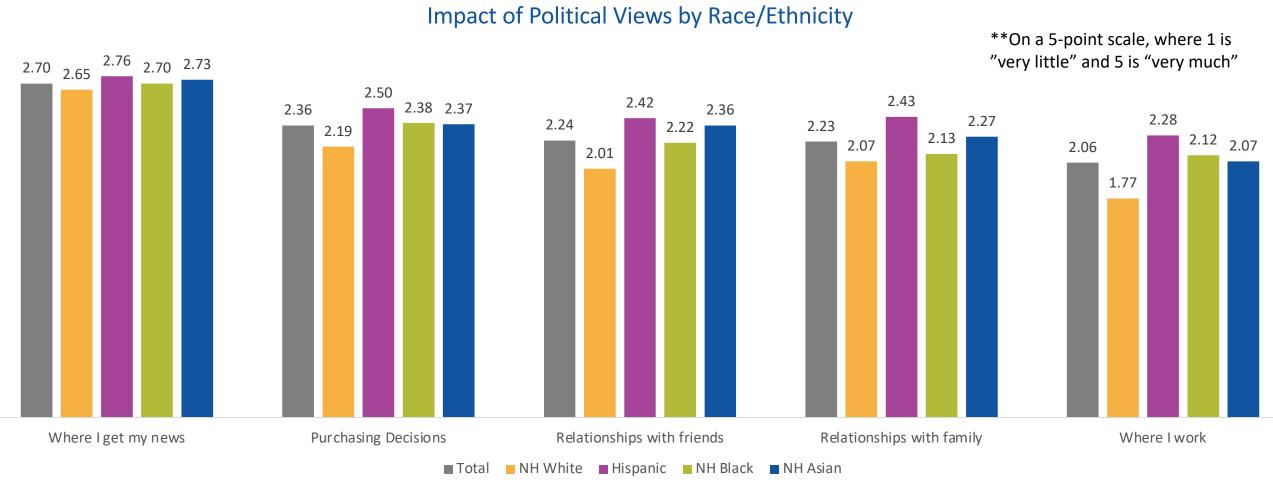

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## Impact of Political Views on Choices by Race/Ethnicity



Political views have the biggest impact on where all race/ethnicities get their news. Similarly, purchasing decisions are the second most impacted for each race/ethnicity. For Hispanics and NH Whites, relationships with family are the next most impacted by political beliefs. For NH Blacks and NH Asians, it is relationships with friends. Hispanics report a higher impact on all choices.



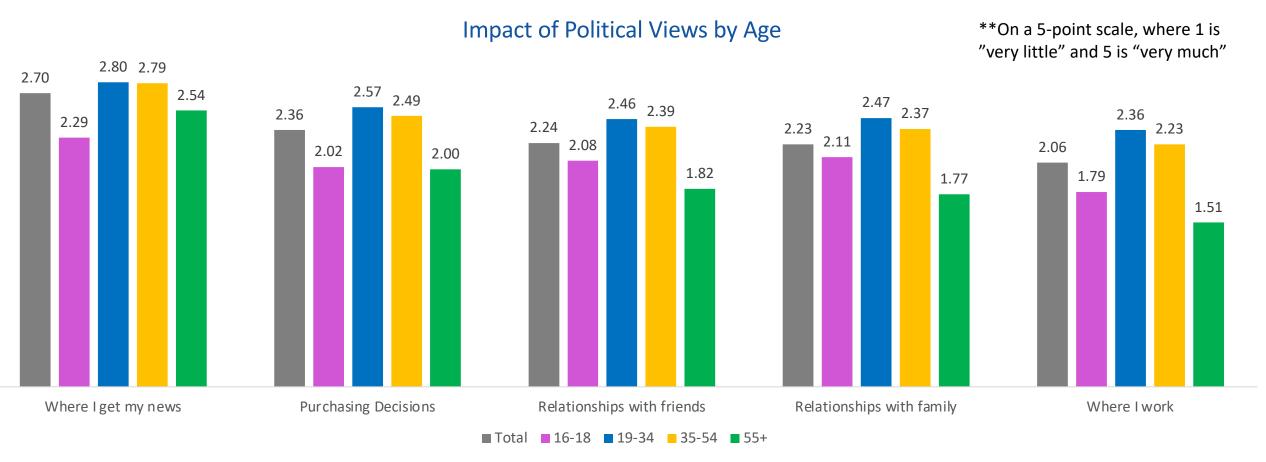

#### Impact of Political Views on Choices by Age



Those ages 19-54 are more likely than other ages to say their political views impact their choices, especially those in the age group 19-34. People ages 55+ are the least impacted by their political views in every aspect.

On a 5-point scale, 19-34-year-olds report an average of 2.8 when it comes to the impact of their political views on where they get their news, more than halfway to 5, "very much".

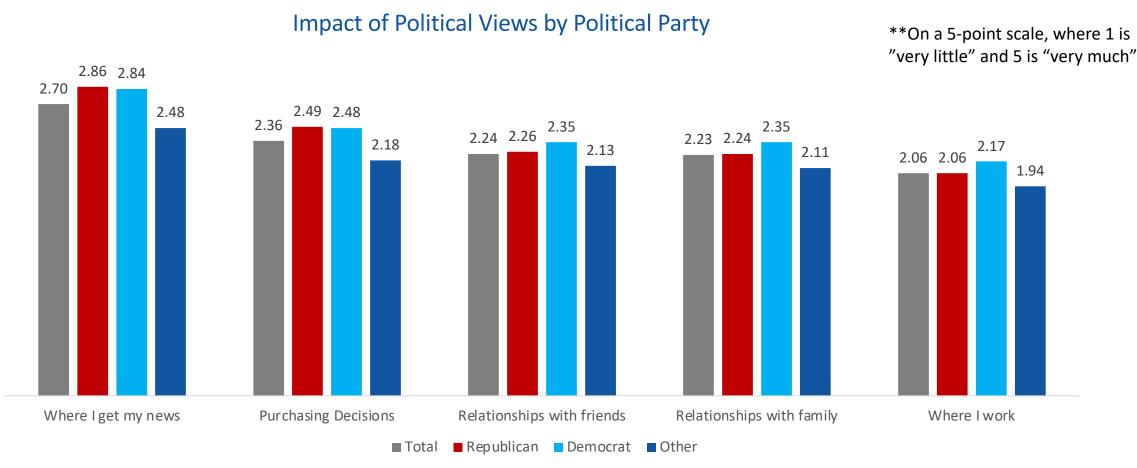

## Impact of Political Views on Choices by Self-Reported Political Party



Democrats feel their relationships with friends and family and where they choose to work are more impacted by their political views than Republicans while Republicans are more impacted when it comes to where they get their news and where they purchase items. Those who do not consider themselves a member of any party are least impacted by their political beliefs; however, where they get their news is the most impacted.
